How this info can change current practice	Inspirational leadership is paramount to highly effective academic teams. This presentation will highlight tangible pearls, as well as avoidable pitfalls, in personal and team development that is both foundational and critical to success in academic emergency medicine and beyond.
Major teaching point #1	The primary motivation for employee engagement is the sense of senior management's interest in one's well-being. As a manager it is paramount to create a strong team, nourish ideas, and develop individuals so that others can take on new roles and grow in their responsibilities.
Major teaching point #2	It is important to make the most of group meeting times with techniques such as: setting an agenda, allowing space and time for participation, open ended listening, managing group dynamics.
Major teaching point #3 (as needed)	EQ is a critical component of leadership success. And, fortunately it can be learned and refined through coaching, positive role-modeling, and honest self-reflection, self-analysis, and a true willingness to utilize feedback to enact change in your own actions and behaviors.
