<b>Major teaching point #1</b>	Communication is key. This includes transparency to the extent possible.
<b>Major teaching point #2</b>	People want a way to connect – figure out methods for your residents and faculty to be involved and find purpose in helping others/responding
<b>Major teaching point #3 (as needed)</b>	Develop a crisis management plan ahead of time
