<b>Major teaching point #1</b>	- Every EM program conducts some form of an orientation/bootcamp and there is overlap in content. Pooling resources allows programs to enhance effectiveness by selecting the best teachers and teaching modalities by utilizing each other's faculty and resources.
<b>Major teaching point #2</b>	- By collaborating on a regional intern bootcamp there is improved camaraderie between program leadership, faculty and residents. This promotes other professional and training experiences
