- · Quantitative data is likely to skew towards the positive end of the scale
- Consider the logistics involved in systematically implementing patient-completed evaluations. Technology may help.
- · Make sure patients know who they're evaluating
- Aim for formative assessments that will be useful to residents
- · Consider qualitative data and standardized patients
